

Join internationally bestselling author Kate Forsyth for a week in beautiful Stratfordupon-Avon, the birthplace of William Shakespeare, at a writing retreat designed to help you re-discover your creativity and joy in writing.

This retreat is for writers at any stage of their careers, from those who have always wanted to write but never found the time, to those who are deeply immersed in a creative project and want to find the way to boost it to the next level.

Spend your mornings talking, listening, laughing and playing with words with Kate and your fellow students. Spend your afternoons exploring the glorious countryside of Oxford and the Cotswolds, with landscapes and towns that have inspired some of the world's most beloved authors



Discover Oxford, 'the city of dreaming spires', and have a restorative ale in the pub where C.S. Lewis and J.R.R. Tolkien first shared their enchanted worlds. Walk the streets where Shakespeare once trod, and read the curse he cast on anyone who disturbed his grave. Wander through some of England's most beautiful gardens, and be inspired by the romantic setting of castles and yew mazes, mysterious circles of standing stones, and haunted manor halls.



Literary Tours

On four afternoons, you will join the others in the group to discover the most fascinating historical and literary sites that Oxford and the Cotswolds have to offer. On the remaining four afternoons, you are free to write in the solitude and quiet of your own room, or to explore the many charming shops, museums, stately homes and castles in the area.



STRATFORD-UPON-AVON

the birthplace of William Shakespeare, steeped in culture and history

You will be staying in the picturesque 17th century Shakespeare Hotel, which is situated in the heart of the medieval market town of Stratford-upon-Avon. It's a short stroll away from many of the town's most famous sights, such as Shakespeare's birthplace, Holy Trinity Church where his body rests, the Royal Shakespeare Company theatre, and the River Avon.

With more than 800 years of history, Stratford-upon-Avon also has all the shops, pubs, restaurants and modern conveniences you could hope for, without losing any of its period charm. You can walk along the river or sit and watch the swans glide by. Visit the butterfly farm, or take a ghost tour. See a play performed by the Royal Shakespeare Company, or drift over the Cotswolds in a hot air balloon.



A little bit about your TOUR DIRECTOR & WRITING MENTOR

Kate Forsyth wrote her first novel at the age of seven and has now sold more than a million copies internationally.

Recently voted one of Australia's Favourite 15 Novelists, Kate Forsyth has been called 'one of the finest writers of this generation'. She has written more than 40 books, for all age groups and across many genres, and published in almost 20 countries.

Her most recent book, The Blue Rose, is a story of love and betrayal set against the backdrop of Imperial China and the French Revolution. Other novels for adults include Bitter Greens, which won the 2015 American Library Association award for Best Historical Fiction; and The Wild Girl, which was named the Most Memorable Love Story of 2013. Kate's books for children include the

collection of fairy-tale retellings Vasilisa the Wise & Other Tales of Brave Young Women, illustrated by Lorena Carrington; and The Impossible Quest fantasy series which has been optioned for a film. Kate has a BA in literature, a MA in creative writing and a doctorate in fairy tale studies, and is also an accredited master storyteller with the Australian Guild of Storytellers. She is a direct descendant of Charlotte Waring Atkinson, the author of the first book for children ever published in Australia.

THE WRITING COURSE

All genres of fiction have their own conventions and characteristics, which can sometimes seem like unbreakable rules. By drawing together different elements of different genres, however, the writer can create ground-breaking novels of great freshness and originality.

For seven days, Kate will share with you all the secrets she has learned about writing stories which fire the imagination, touch the heart, and keep readers turning the pages long into the night.

Whether you are working on a medieval supernatural thriller, a time travel romance, a children's fantasy adventure, a contemporary novel that draws on ancient myths, or a historical novel about the lives of forgotten women... you will discover your muse in this week-long inspirational retreat.



For seven days, from 9am to 12 noon, you will write, read, listen, learn and discuss all aspects of creative writing, from first discovering your story to finding a publisher.

- The key conventions of the world's most popular literary genres (including contemporary and historical fiction, dual timelines, crime and mystery, romance, horror, fantasy and magic realism).
- · What rules to keep and what rules can be broken.
- · Storytelling patterns and structures.

- The importance of voice, and how to find it.
- · Building characters that are vivid and vital.
- · Creating a strong sense of time and place.

ITINERARY

Sunday 18 April

Walking Tour of Oxford

Meet Kate Forsyth and your Tour Manager Roger Bailey at Oxford Railway Station at midday. Follow in the footsteps of Lewis Carroll, C.S. Lewis, J.R.R. Tolkien, Philip Pullman and Colin Dexter's famous detective Inspector Morse around the City of Dreaming Spires. Enjoy afternoon tea in Oxford before traveling together by bus to Stratfordupon-Avon.

Settle into your accommodation at the Shakespeare Hotel, an atmospheric 17th century inn on Chapel Street in Stratford-upon-Avon. Order room service and rest and recover in peace and solitude, or head out to explore the birthplace of the Bard. There are many atmospheric pubs and restaurants within walking distance of the hotel.



Tuesday 20 April

Discovering Your Voice: 9am-12pm

The class will discuss The Writer's Voice, and how the choices a writer makes about such literary techniques as point of view, language, sentence structures and so on, creates the voice of the story. We will examine the work of writers in the set reading list to see the difference in their voices. We will also look at creating characters that are vivid and vital, with their own individual voice

Tour: Secrets of the Cotswolds

(including Lunch at Stow-on-the-Wold)

Explore the dreamy villages of the Cotswolds, built in the famous golden stone that glows in the sun. Enjoy some of England's best countryside as you wind your way through such famous villages as Bourton-on-the Water and Stow-in-the Wold. Discover a stone circle set in a meadow of wild flowers and hear the intriguing local legend behind its creation.

Monday 19 April

Discovering Your Story: 9am-12pm

Students introduce themselves and talk about their writing. The class will then discuss how to discover your story, from the first flash of inspiration through to beginning to plan your story's narrative structure.

We will also examine the key conventions of the world's most popular literary genres and how we can combine them in new ways to enliven our own writing.

Afternoon free to write, relax or explore.

Thursday 22 April

Storytelling: 9am-12pm

What makes a good story? Why is storytelling so important in human society? What can we learn from the structures and archetypes of myths and fairy tales to make our own writing more powerful and meaningful?

Tour: Walking Tour of Stratford-upon-Avon

Enjoy lunch at the world-famous 'Dirty Duck' pub and then take a walking tour of Stratford-upon-Avon with Kate and Roger. View Shakespeare's birthplace and grave, and the world famous Royal Shakespeare Theatre. Visit Anne Hathaway's Cottage, a quaint thatched farmhouse surrounded by stunning gardens (please note, this is a walk of 20 minutes or more from Stratford-upon-Avon so please inform us if you would prefer to miss this part of the tour).

Wednesday 21 April

The Importance of Research: 9am-12pm

The more deeply you immerse yourself in the time and place of your novel, the more vividly you'll be able to bring it to life on the page. But how do you go about it? What do you need to know? Should you trust the Internet? Do you need to go to the place you are writing about? What about gaining access to primary sources? And how much research is too much research? We will be reading examples from authors who have cleverly used historical detail to bring their work alive.

Your afternoon and evening is at leisure to write, relax or go exploring.







Friday 23 April





Narrative Building Blocks: 9am-12pm

This workshop looks in depth at the key narrative building blocks: openings and endings, scene structure and development, plots and sub-plots, conflict and resolution. We shall also examine such literary devices as unreliable narrators, foreshadowing, flashbacks, red herrings and cliffhangers, with reference to the books on the recommended reading list.

Tour: Warwick

Experience one thousand years of jaw-dropping history at Warwick Castle, a medieval castle developed on the foundations of a fortification built by William the Conqueror in 1068. Within the castle's mighty walls are a magnificent Great Hall, lavish state rooms, haunted bedrooms and a tranquil private chapel. The castle is surrounded by 64 acres of glorious landscaped gardens, with topiary peacocks and an island with a secret past.

Your evening is your own to write, relax or go exploring.





Saturday 24 April

Dangerous Writing: 9am-12pm

Good writing is dangerous writing. It is not afraid to surprise and shock, to unsettle and make uneasy, to seduce and subvert. Yet many people find it hard to write scenes of sex and violence, or to kill off favourite characters, or to touch on matters that might upset or repulse. How far can you go in your own writing? Are there any topics that remain taboo? Should you be worried about what your friends and family may think? Is it forgivable to draw upon true life stories, whether your own or other people's? We discuss the dangers and pleasures of dangerous writing.

Your afternoon and evening have been left free since Friday 22nd June is Midsummer's Eve, and there will be so much for you all to do. The famous circle of stones at Stonehenge is only two hours drive away, and the lesser-known but equally impressive stones of Avebury even closer at one-and-a-half hours away. Stratford-upon-Avon comes alive with street performers and theatrical events, or you can sit around a bonfire and listen to songs and stories in Anne Hathaway's magical garden. Wear a crown of flowers, drink some mead, and enjoy one of England's most magical nights.




Monday 26 April

The Writer's Life: 9am-12pm

Writing a novel is only part of a writer's life. Writers must also learn to rewrite and edit, to proofread, to work with editors and publishers and publicists, to promote, to teach, and to manage social media and marketing. At the same time, writers must try to find a balance between work, art and life.

Writing can become an all-consuming obsession, ruinous to one's health and relationships. However, if managed well, it can become a source of enormous creative fulfillment and a lucrative career choice. How can you avoid the rest and achieve the second? This session will also leave plenty of time for lots of questions!

Your afternoon will be free for writing or to relax.

Cancellation

If you need to cancel your booking all effort will be made to find a new participant to take your place. If a new participant can be found \$300 will be forfeited from your refund as an administration fee.

If your place cannot be filled your booking will remain and no refund will be given if less than 90 days until tour commencement. If you cancel more than 90 days prior to the start of the tour you will be eligible for a refund of 70% of the tour cost. All requests for cancellation of your booking and refund of funds must be made in writing.
